Doctor of Theology (Th.D.), Doctor of Philosophy of Theology (Ph.D.)

Total Hours 40

Objectives

Theology is the study of God; therefore, this program of study will provide a strong foundation of theology and help prepare the student for Christian ministry as a Bible teacher, preacher, missionary, and various other public and personal ministry roles. Anyone called to ministry, regardless of their particular calling, should possess an intense knowledge of New Testament ministry and a deeper conviction and commitment to his/her own personal call to ministry. Upon completion of the program the student should demonstrate a greater understanding of God, a methodology for Bible study and interpretation, and the ability to effectively use the Word of God in Christian ministry.

Course Requirements

In order to graduate with a Doctor of Theology (Th.D.) or Doctor of Philosophy of Theology (Ph.D.), the student must have satisfactorily completed the following requirements:

1. Pre-requisite: Master's degree (or equivalent) in related/approved field
2. A minimum of 40 Credits for program completion
3. A minimum overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5
4. Two letters of recommendation
5. All financial obligations settled with Land of Goshen Institute of Theology
